August

ASSIGNMENT OF ROLES AND FUNCTION

- Each country delegation must appoint an Ambassador assigned to a GA (General Assembly) Committee.
- Non-Member delegations with GA seats must assign a Head of delegation to a GA Committee.
- If no GA seat is held, the Head of Delegation may be placed in another eligible forum.
- All delegates must be assigned to a specific GA Committee, Council, or Sub-Commission.
- MUN-Directors are not permitted to coach or advise delegates during sessions.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT APPLICATIONS

GENERAL RULES

- Individual student applicants must submit:
 - Completed Application Form.
 - Recommendation from MUN-Director, as part of the student application form.
- MUN-Director submits the full application to applications@thimun.org by the final deadline.

I. STUDENT OFFICER ROLES & REQUIREMENTS

- The Student Officer team includes the Executive Committee, Presidents, Deputy Presidents, Committee Chairs, and Deputy Chairs across various forums.
- All Student Officer applicants must:
 - Have strong knowledge of the THIMUN Rules of Procedure.
 - Understand current international affairs and assigned agenda issues.
- Selected Student Officers:
 - Receive instructions from the Executive Committee.
 - Complete Research Reports by end of November.
 - Attend **mandatory online briefings prior to the conference and in presence at the conference venue on Monday 25 January 2027** at the World Forum The Hague.
 - Participate in lobbying and oversee committee work during the conference.

Committee Chairs and Deputy Presidents

- **Committee Chairs:**
 - Oversee one of the General Assembly Committees during sessions.
 - These positions are usually filled by candidates with prior experience as Deputy Presidents or Deputy Chairs at THIMUN or THIMUN-Affiliated conferences.
- **Deputy Presidents** (of the three Commissions and Special Conference):
 - Preside over sub-commissions during sessions.
 - Assist Presidents during lobbying.

Deputy Committee Chairs

- Deputy Chair roles are designed to give younger students leadership experience.
- Aim: identify potential future leaders for upcoming THIMUN sessions.

II. NATO SUMMIT

- The **THIMUN NATO Summit** consists of 32 student delegates who will represent NATO member states, replicating the real NATO structure.
- Participants address political, diplomatic, economic, legal, and military aspects in their discussions.
- **Applicants must:**
 - Be from participating schools.
 - Have previous THIMUN experience.
 - Submit the NATO Application Form.
- Main task: draft and adopt a **joint communiqué** (a binding agreement, unlike standard MUN resolutions).
- The Summit follows Security Council-style rules and conducts all debates in plenary sessions.
- Quality of debate relies on participants' experience, flexibility, and enthusiasm.
- **All NATO delegates must attend a mandatory briefing on Monday 25 January 2027** at the World Forum The Hague

III. HISTORICAL SECURITY COUNCIL YEAR 1967 (HSC)

- THIMUN 2027 will feature a Historical Security Council (HSC) simulation focused on the year 1967.
- Fifteen schools will each send two delegates to represent the 1967 Security Council member states.
- The HSC includes five permanent and ten elected members.
- Interested students must submit the HSC Application Form.
- Delegates will reenact the Council's response to three major 1967 events, in chronological order.
- Focus: explore potential actions the Security Council could have taken during these crises.

IV. THIMUN INTERNATIONAL COURTS: INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL COURT (ICC) & INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR THE LAW OF THE SEA (ITLOS)

- **The ICC** focuses on the prosecution of individuals accused of genocide, crimes against humanity and war crimes.
- **The ITLOS** focuses on the peaceful settlement of disputes between States concerning the interpretation and application of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea.
- The proceedings focus on the presentation of evidence, witness examination and legal argument under the Rome Statute and the International Law of the Sea respectively.
- 20 participants:
 - **3 Student Officers** (2 Co-Presidents, 1 Registrar).

- **8 Advocates:** four for each case: Teams of two serving as Prosecutors and Defence Counsel (ICC), and Applicants and Respondents (ITLOS).
- **9 Judges:** nine participants will serve exclusively as Judges. Advocates will serve as Judges in the International Court in which they are not acting as counsel.

Applications open to students with:

- Strong academic ability and MUN experience.
- An interest in international affairs and international law.
- Strong independent research skills.
- **Applicants must indicate** their preferred role and outline relevant qualifications and experience.
- **Selected participants** must prepare for their assigned role, study the THIMUN International Courts materials, and attend the mandatory briefing on **Monday 25 January 2027**, at the World Forum; The Hague.

BANK CHARGES

- Schools must cover all bank charges related to conference fee payments.

- Schools take full responsibility for travel to/from the Netherlands for the THIMUN conference.
- **Schools should check:**

INSURANCE

- Schools are strongly advised to obtain **cancellation, travel, and medical insurance**.
- **THIMUN is not responsible** for any related costs incurred by schools or participants.

VISA APPLICATION PROCESS (⚠️ IMPORTANT)

- **For students and teachers requiring a visa to enter the Netherlands**, the MUN-Director must send a formal request to the THIMUN office (visa@thimun.org) using the visa template on our website under downloads.
- **DO NOT SUBMIT A VISA REQUESTS UNTIL YOUR FORM II HAS BEEN SUBMITTED.**
The Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs has strict instructions we must adhere to. We cannot submit a letter unless the participation (FORM II) is submitted.
- All **visa requests from the same school** must be submitted **together in a single document**.
- Visa processing takes time, late submissions risk delays or non-attendance.
- Upon receiving required information, the THIMUN Office issues a **formal invitation letter** to the MUN-Director for visa applications.

- **Request must include the following details for each applicant:**
 - Full name (as written in the passport).
 - Date of birth.
 - Nationality.
 - Passport number.
 - Passport dates of issue and expiration.

AIRPORT TRANSFERS

- **THIMUN & ITO Tours** offer an airport pick-up service to your hotel/hostel or the World Forum.
- **Alternative transport options:**
 - From **Amsterdam/Schiphol Airport**:
 - Take a direct train to **Den Haag Hollands Spoor (HS)** or **Den Haag Centraal (CS)**
 - From **Den Haag Hollands Spoor station (HS)**:
 - Take tram **1** (direction Scheveningen, stop **World Forum**)
 - From **Den Haag Centraal Station (CS)**, there are **3 possibilities**:
 - Take Tram **17** (direction Statenkwartier, stop **Kunstmuseum Den Haag**)
 - Take Bus **24** (direction Kijkduin, stop **Kunstmuseum Den Haag**)
 - Take Bus **28** (direction DH Zuiderstrand, stop **Statenplein**)
 - All options are within a short walking distance to the conference venue.

HTM PUBLIC TRANSPORT CONFERENCE TICKET

- At registration, all participants (students, MUN-Directors, chaperones) receive a **4-day HTM public transport ticket** (valid Tuesday to Friday).
- Ticket allows unlimited tram/bus travel in **The Hague and Scheveningen** during the conference.
- **Extra day cards** available online via the HTM website.
- Schools **not needing HTM cards** must notify the THIMUN Office by **1 December 2026**.
 - These schools receive a **€20.00 discount per participant** on the participation fee.

ACCOMMODATION

- THIMUN requires accommodation details for all participants during the conference.
- Schools must provide the **name of their accommodation** on **FORM II**.
- **Local students** staying at home are **exempt from this requirement**.
- Information is for administrative purposes only.
- THIMUN does **not handle hotel bookings or changes**.

CONDUCT

GENERAL BEHAVIOUR

- THIMUN The Hague is an educational simulation of UN Councils
 - Delegates act as **diplomats and ambassadors** for their assigned country/organisation and school.
- High standards of **personal conduct and behaviour** are required both inside and outside the World Forum.
- **Proper delegate behaviour** is essential for maintaining strong relations with the **World Forum, the City of The Hague, as well as the diplomatic and business communities**.
- Schools must **select students carefully** and avoid bringing those likely to cause disciplinary issues.
- Misconduct affects the reputation of both **THIMUN, and the school** involved.
- **Attendance at THIMUN is by invitation**. Schools or individual students may lose the privilege if students do not uphold proper standards and accepted behaviour.

MUN-DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES AND CONDUCT

- All students must be **accompanied and supervised by designated MUN-Director(s)**.
- A MUN-Director must be a teacher at the school or one of the participating schools
- Each group should have **at least two MUN-Directors**.
 - Small or local delegations may have just one MUN-Director.
- **Students staying in hotels must be supervised by MUN-Directors**, who must:
 - Stay in the same hotel.
 - Have rooms located close to student rooms.
 - Sign the hotel Code of Conduct (via ITO PCO) and ensure student compliance.
- At least one MUN-Director per school must be:
 - **Present at the World Forum** during conference hours.
 - Attend the **MUN-Director meeting on Tuesday**.
- **MUN-Directors** are required to **adhere to the dress code** (see below).

DRESS CODE

- **Formal dress and appropriate footwear** are required from Tuesday to Friday, reflecting what real UN diplomats wear.
- **Prohibited attire** includes:
 - National dress.
 - Military uniforms.
 - Armbands.
- Dress code is enforced to maintain professionalism and avoid offending other delegates.

CONDUCT IN THE WORLD FORUM

- Delegates and teachers must be courteous to World Forum staff and THIMUN staff, many of whom volunteer their own time to serve participants.
- **Smoking is strictly prohibited** throughout the World Forum.
- **Alcohol consumption and drug use** is not permitted.

CONDUCT IN HOTELS

- THIMUN relies on the **goodwill of hotels** to offer affordable accommodation for delegates.
- **Poor behaviour by even one student** can jeopardise future hotel availability.
- Students must act responsibly to maintain **positive relationships with hotel staff and management**.
 - Students must **always be polite and considerate to hotel staff and other guests**.
 - A **curfew of 11 p.m.** is recommended each night. **No noise in hotel rooms after 10 p.m.**

TOBACCO, ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

- **Smoking, alcohol and drug use are strictly prohibited inside the World Forum.**
- MUN-Directors must set and enforce their own rules for students outside the venue.
- **In the Netherlands, the legal drinking age is 18.**
- MUN-Directors are responsible for enforcing rules on tobacco, alcohol, and drugs both on and off conference premises.

THIMUN POLICY ON UNDIPLOMATIC BEHAVIOUR, BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND DISCRIMINATION

- All forms of disrespectful behaviour, bullying, harassment, and discrimination are strictly prohibited in preparation of and during THIMUN conferences.
- Disrespectful behaviour violates THIMUN's educational mission and core values.
- Incidents of undiplomatic behaviour, bullying, harassment or discrimination should be reported to the THIMUN Foundation's Board or staff either directly or through:
 - Faculty advisor.
 - Head committee chair.
 - Executive student officers.
- Consequences may include:
 - Verbal reprimand.
 - Expulsion from the conference without compensation.
 - Barring individuals and/or their schools from future THIMUN events and conferences.
- The THIMUN Foundation reserves the right to take any actions they deem necessary to ensure a safe and respectful environment.

PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL SAFETY

- Every THIMUN participant has the right to feel safe, included and affirmed.
- THIMUN is committed to creating a community in which all students and staff thrive, and all identities are affirmed and protected.
- Undiplomatic behaviour, bullying, harassment, and discrimination violate THIMUN's core values and are not acceptable at THIMUN conferences.

UNDESIRABLE BEHAVIOUR

- THIMUN wants to ensure a **pleasant and safe environment** for all participants.
- Discrimination, intimidation, vandalism, provocation, aggression, bullying, nuisance, or violence in any form will **not be tolerated**.
- Such behaviour may lead to removal from the conference without a refund.

DEFINITION OF BULLYING:

- **Bullying includes written, verbal, digital, or physical actions that:**
 - Harm a student's ability to participate in or benefit from a THIMUN conference.
 - Place a student in reasonable fear of harm.
- **Bullying may be based on actual or perceived:**
 - Race, colour, national origin.
 - Sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.
 - Disability.
 - Religion.
- **Bullying also includes targeting a student due to characteristics of someone they associate with (e.g., friend or family member).**

DEFINITION OF HARASSEMENT:

- **Harassment** includes written, verbal, digital, or physical actions that:
 - Negatively impact a student's ability to participate in or benefit from a THIMUN conference
- **May be based on actual or perceived:**
 - Race, colour, national origin.
 - Sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.
 - Disability.
 - Religion.
- **Harassment also includes conduct that targets a student because of a characteristic of a student's friend, family member, or associated group.**

DEFINITION OF CYBERBULLYING:

- **Cyberbullying** involves using any electronic or digital communication to **bully or harass**.
 - Applies **regardless of location** or type of digital platform used.
 - Follows the same definitions and standards as bullying and harassment (see above definitions).
